Archdiocese of Chicago Documentary on Pope John Paul II & The Election of Pope Benedict

This half-hour program produced by the Archdiocese of Chicago Office of Radio & Television features memorable video from the Pope's historic visit to Chicago in 1979. Chicago area Catholics talk about how Pope John Paul II touched their lives. We hear from Francis Cardinal George, bishops and theologians, as well as from lay Catholics such as a Polish dance troupe that had the privilege of performing for the Pope. The documentary also includes the election of Pope Benedict the 16th. Fr. Greg Sakowicz, the Pastor of St. Mary of the Woods Parish in Chicago, hosts this moving tribute.

States of Faith: A Look at Religion in America: Explores the vital role of religion in people's lives. George Gallup, Jr. and Stephen Carter, among others, help interpret religion in today's culture. 1 hour. (Catholic Communications Campaign)

Answering God's Call: Experience of Priesthood: Two different men, sharing the same faith. Two different styles of ministry, facing the same challenges. Answering God's Call brings viewers into the daily lives of two priests: Fr. Mitch Rozanski, pastor of two parishes in Baltimore, and Fr. Pat Smith, pastor of a church in rural Maryland. As we journey inside a church steeple and through parishioners' homes, we experience a different form of priesthood than the one more familiar from Sunday Mass. Produced by State of the Art, Inc., the documentary shows two devoted men bringing God's love to young and old with humor and sensitivity. 1 hour. (Catholic Communications Campaign)

Zimbabwe Fight for Life: A production about the daily struggle of the poor in Zimbabwe. (Catholic Relief Services) 30 minutes

Prodigal Son: a 10 minute reflective drama about a conflict between a father and son that ends in reconciliation. (LifeTeen)

Unreal TV: hosted by actor Matt Smith this 10 min. video reflects upon the many influences of media upon people (Life Teen)

Journey of the Heart: a presentation about the University of St. Mary of the Lake Seminary in Mundelein Illinois. 10 minutes.

Sears Tower vs Mother Nature: Produced by WGN and hosted by Tom Skilling this video is a behind the scenes look at the Sears Tower. (30 minutes)

NO-ING GOD

Some teens think Christianity is all rules and no fun. Others mistakenly believe it doesn't matter what you believe, as long as you are "spiritual." Still others say they are too smart for Christianity. Many have been disappointed by the "hypocrites" in the church. This episode of VELOCITY takes a look at why young people are saying "no" to God. Teens will be encouraged to look at the evidence and choose God, who loves them even when they don't love themselves. (20 minutes Blue-Fish TV)

ROAD KILL

Most young people have been rejected at some point by their friends. They are made to feel like losers among those who are smarter, more athletic, better looking and more talented. The consequences can be devastating. This episode of VELOCITY looks at the lives of teens that have experienced bullying, discrimination and rejection. This video will encourage ways to promote acceptance and offer practical tips for those who feel rejected. (20 minutes Blue-Fish TV)
